

**Mandatory Language for Monitoring and Reporting Violation
Failure to Submit a Surface Water Monthly Operating Report (SWMOR)
SURFACE WATER MONITORING, ROUTINE MAJOR**

The CITY OF TOYAH, PWS ID TX1950004, has violated the monitoring and reporting requirements set by Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) in Title 30, Texas Administrative Code (30 TAC) Section 290, Subchapter F. Public water systems that treat surface water and/or ground water under the direct influence of surface water are required to submit monthly operating reports with operational data of the treatment, disinfection and quality of the water provided to their customers.

**Mandatory Language for Monitoring and Reporting Violation
TOTAL ORGANIC CARBON, ROUTINE MAJOR**

The CITY OF TOYAH, TX1950004, has violated the monitoring and reporting requirements set by Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) in Title 30, Texas Administrative Code (30 TAC), Section 290, Subchapter F. Public water systems that use a series of treatment processes that includes coagulation, flocculation, sedimentation or clarification, and filtration as part of the overall treatment protocol must monitor Total Organic Carbon and report the results of that monitoring to the TCEQ on a monthly basis.

We failed to monitor and/or report the following constituents TOC

Results of monitoring are an indicator of whether drinking water is protected from potential adverse health effects associated with disinfectants and disinfection by-products. Monitoring Requirements Not Met for:

Our system failed to collect every required coliform sample. Although this incident was not an emergency, as our customers, you have the right to know what happened and what we did (are doing) to correct this situation.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether our drinking water meets health standards. During the Month of April 2016, we did not monitor or test or did not complete all monitoring or testing for coliform bacteria and therefore cannot be sure the quality of your drinking water during that time.

What should I do?

There is nothing you need to do currently. You may continue to drink the water. If a situation arises where the water is no longer safe to drink, we are required to notify you within 24 hours.

What is being done?

We collected every required coliform sample and are no longer in violation.
